Mr. Demarce:

For the month of February I screened all the applicants who applied for the tribal scholarship. Any student who was missing documents I called and/or emailed them to remind them that I needed documents for their tribal scholarship application otherwise their application would be considered incomplete. For the Tribal Scholarship there are currently fifty-one (51) eligible applicants. There were 15 first time college students, 4 part time students with a 3.0-4.0 GPA, 31 full time students with a 3.0-4.0 GPA and 1 full time graduate level student with a 3.0-4.0 GPA.

I worked on updating the JOM application that the local schools fill out for the Tribe. I have the schools update their applications for the JOM funding in case they have more eligible students or if they have fewer students who would meet the qualifications. I did contact other Tribes to get information on their process to update the JOM applications.

I also worked on updating my tribal scholarship spreadsheet and my student's incentive spreadsheet. I worked on resolutions that Secretary Treasurer Street had given me and I kept track of all the resolutions that need to be completed.
