CHANGING YOUR LEGAL NAME

People change their Legal names for a variety of reasons, including:

- * Marriage
- * Divorce
- * You want to reclaim an original family name.
- * You want to change the name your parents named you.
- * Because you just want to.

People are allowed to change their name whenever they so desire unless it is for a Fraudulent purpose. That factor, however, doesn't stop people from changing their names but in that case it is called an "alias".

Names can be changed in two ways:

- 1. By "common usage" one can choose a new name and consistently
- 2. By a formal court procedure.

Both are equally legitimate, but there are limitations:

- You cannot change your name if you have "Fraudulent intent." This means that you may be trying to avoid bankruptcy or some other reaches of the law by becoming someone else
- You cannot use numbers or symbols in your name. However, you can add Roman numerals to the end of your name, such as John Doe IV.
- You cannot use indecent or violent words or anything with a racial slur. Those who give themselves names using these words are considered nicknames.
- The court requires a showing of more than simple desire to change the name of a minor.

NAME CHANGED BY COURT ORDER

A court order leaves you with a public record of the name change and an indisputable right to your new name and it becomes completely legitimate.

Some factors you should be aware of:

- Changing your name will not expunge or excuse mistakes in your past.
- Changing your name to match your significant other, life partner, boyfriend, girlfriend, etc, does not mean that you are legally married to that person.
- Changing a child's last name to match yours does not mean that you have adopted that child.

The most common reasons for changing your name are:

- 1. Desire
- 2. Marriage
- 3. Divorce

PROCEDURE TO CHANGE YOUR NAME

If you want to change your name for no other reason than because you simply want to, you will need to do the following:

- Complete a Petition for Name Change.
 A copy of your birth certificate and tribal enrollment certificate must be submitted with the petition
- 2. Pay the require court filing fee by money order in the amount of \$50.00 to the Spirit Lake Tribal Court
- 3. Complete and submit the attached Notice of Petition for Name Change to the Devils Lake Journal Newspaper, 516 4th Street NE, Devils Lake, North Dakota, or to any other court approved newspaper serving the Spirit Lake Nation Reservation, and surrounding area. The published Notice of Petition for Name Change is to notify the public that you intend to change your name. The Notice must be published for a period of once a week for three consecutive weeks. The cost of publication is your responsibility.
- 4. Obtain an Affidavit of Publication from the Devils Lake Journal (or other approved newspaper) stating that the Notice of Petition for Name Change was published and the dates it was published.
- 5. An Affidavit of-Consent, if applicable, is-required for-name changes for minors. The Affidavit of Consent must be signed by a parent or legal guardian.
- 6. An Order for Name Change granting the name change will be entered at a scheduled court hearing at the Spirit Lake Tribal Court. A hearing will be scheduled upon-receipt of the Affidavit of Publication and court filing fee,

MINORS

For a minor's name change, there are a few additional facts to be aware of:

- An adult will have .to submit the petition with a reason for the change and a parent or a guardian must give his/her consent to the name change.
- The reason for the name change of a minor should be *significant*, such as adoption or bringing a stepchild into the family.
- ➤ Both parents/guardians will be notified of the petition, which means an objecting parent has time to come forward.
- As a result, there could be a dispute over whether the child's name should be

changed. Ultimately, the judge will decide what is in the best interest for the child.

➤ Changing the name of a minor is not the same as a legal adoption or the removal of parental responsibilities toward that child.

MARRIAGE

The marriage license provides for a place to write in your new name. Once you write your new name on the marriage license your done!

DIVORCE

Returning to a maiden name (or any other name) is included in the divorce proceeding, if requested. However, it is not required that people change their names after divorce and a woman who changed her name to that of her husband's surname can continue to use if she so desires.

ADOPTION

Adoption proceedings provide an opportunity to change a child's name and, in some cases, his/her original birth certificate.

CHANGING RECORDS

Once you have your new name, the court suggests that you begin to change your records by changing the name on your Driver's License and on your Social Security Card. Once your new name appears on the two documents, changing the rest of your records will be easier.
